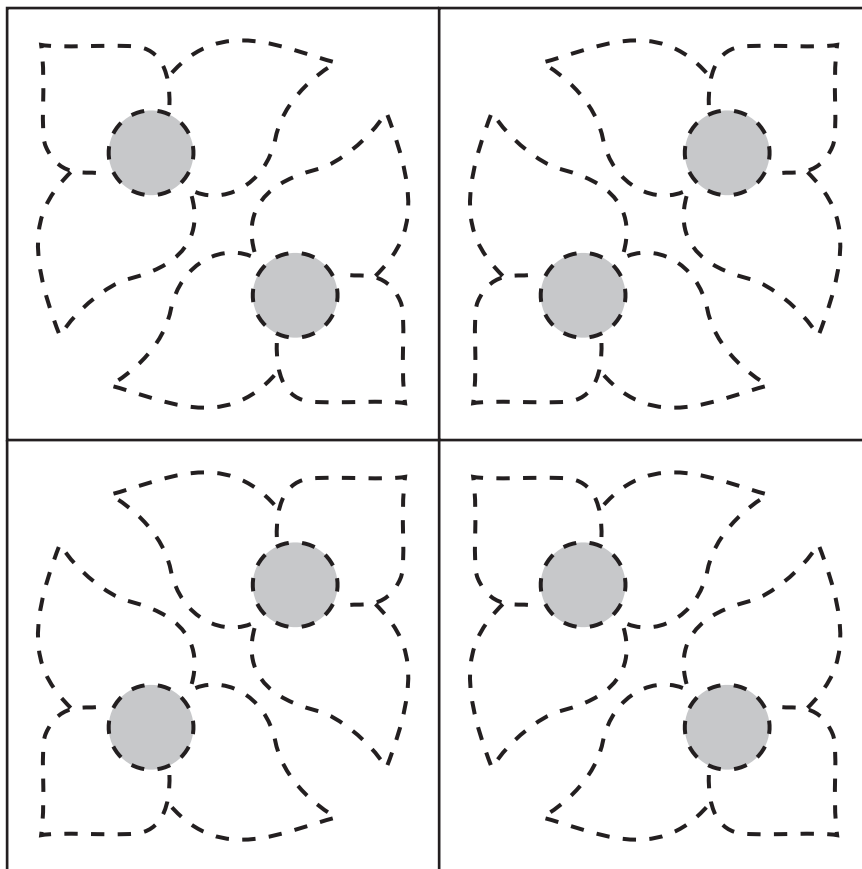


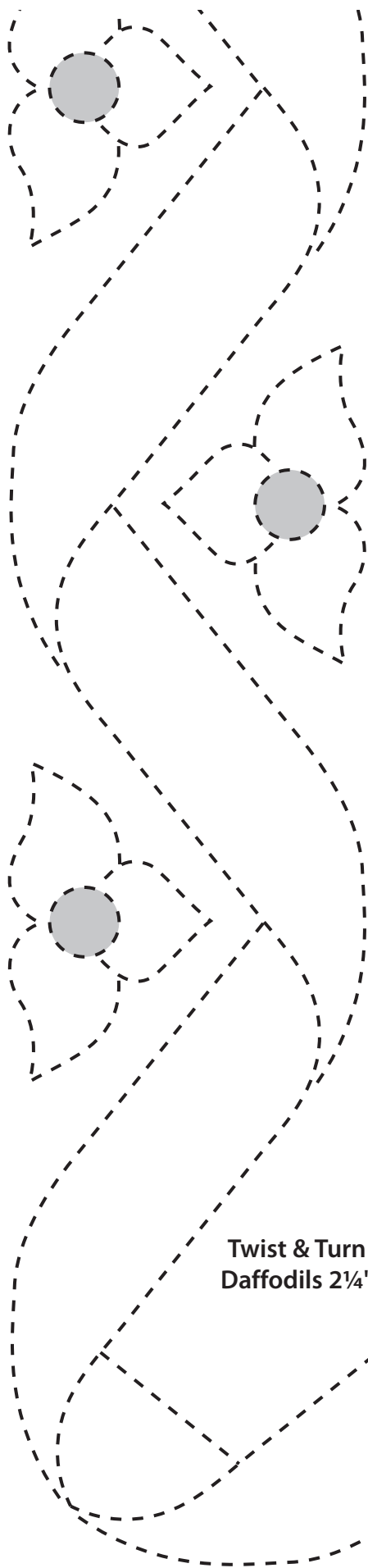
Sashing, Block and Border Designs

■ Sashing

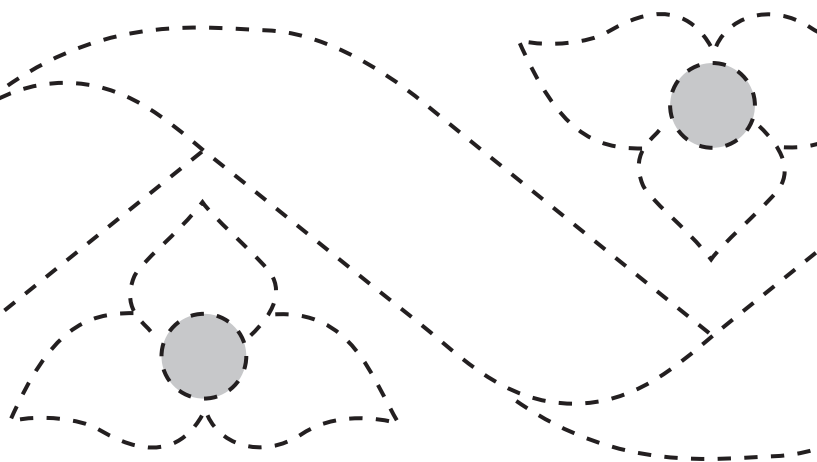
- ❑ A strip of fabric used to set pieced or appliquéd blocks together is called sashing.
- ❑ If cut 3" wide, it will measure 2½" finished. The direction the seams are pressed (toward the block or under the sashing strips) determines the size of the width to be quilted.
- ❑ Outline quilting is done ¼" away from the seams. In-the-ditch quilting is done on the side with no seam allowances underneath.



Window Boxes – Daffodil block variation



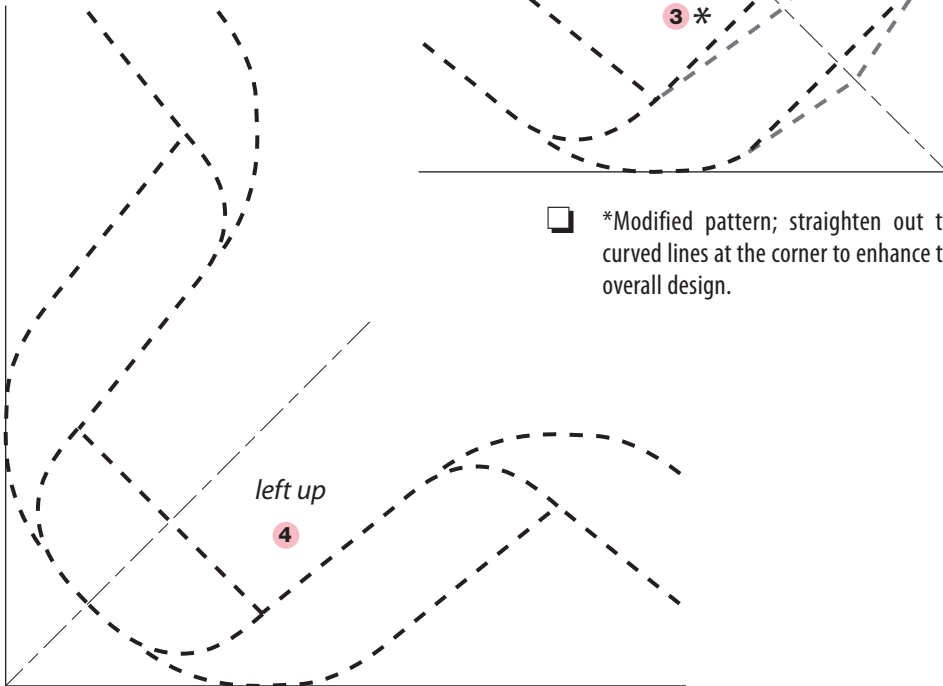
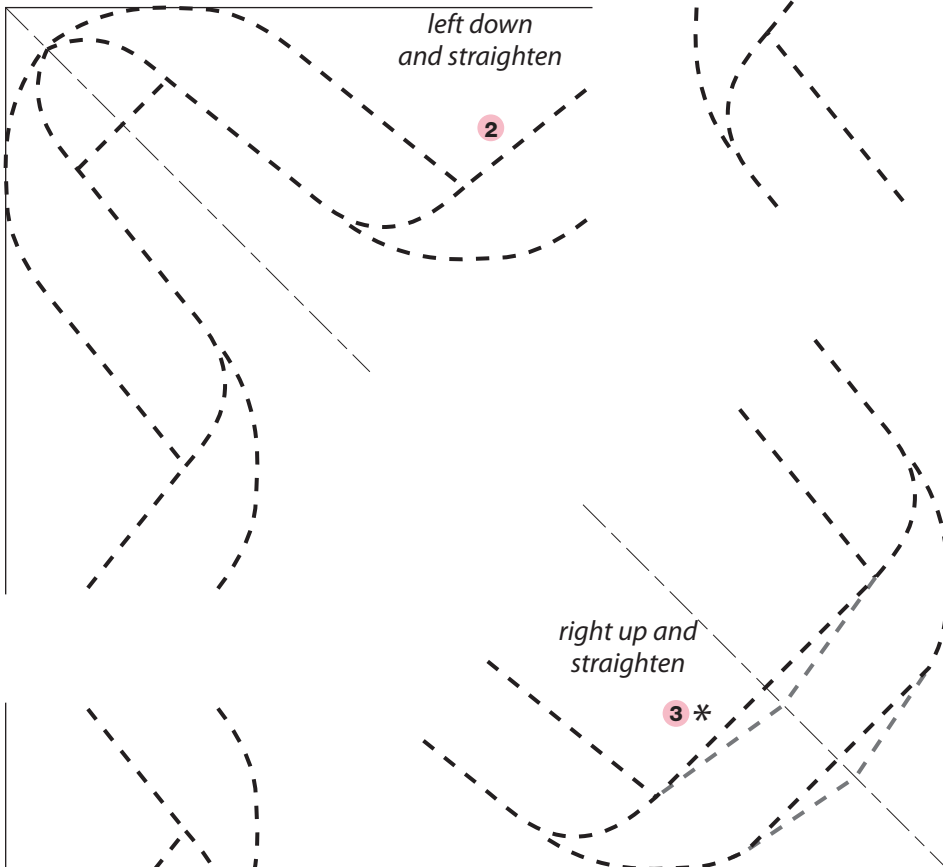
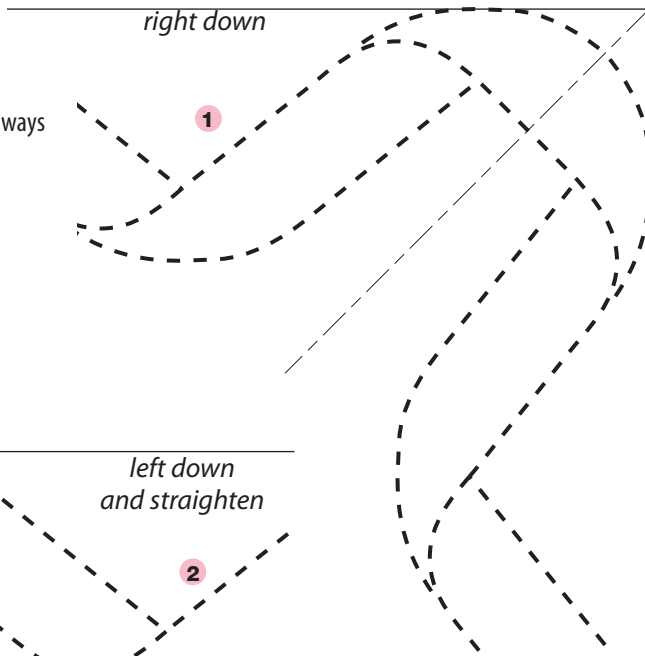

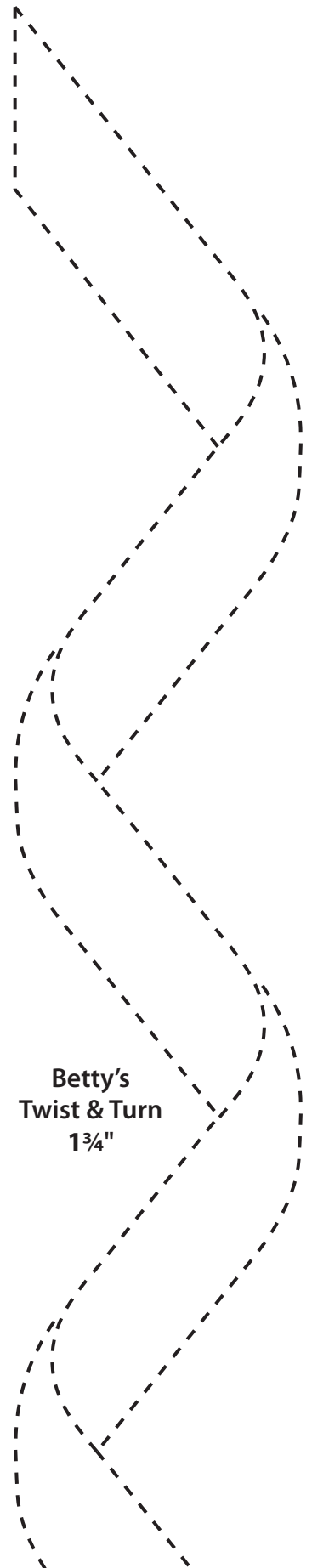
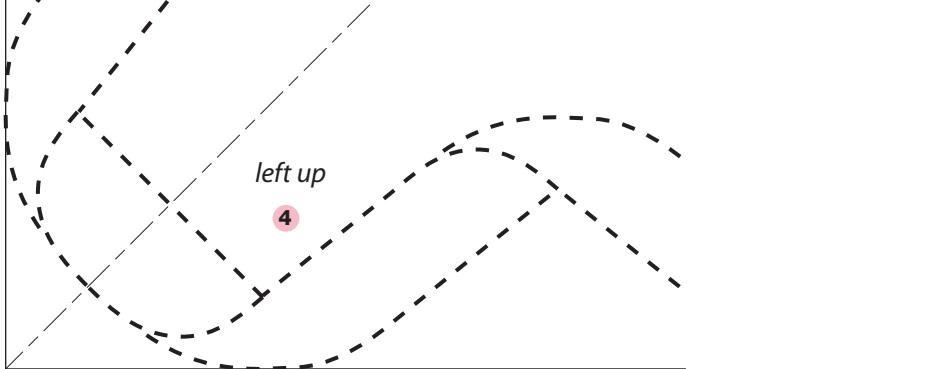
Sashing, Block *and* Border Designs

☐ There are always four ways to miter any corner:

- ① right down,
- ② left down,
- ③ right up,
- ④ left up.



☐ *Modified pattern; straighten out the curved lines at the corner to enhance the overall design.
