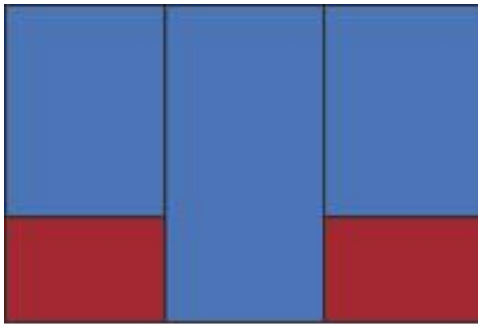

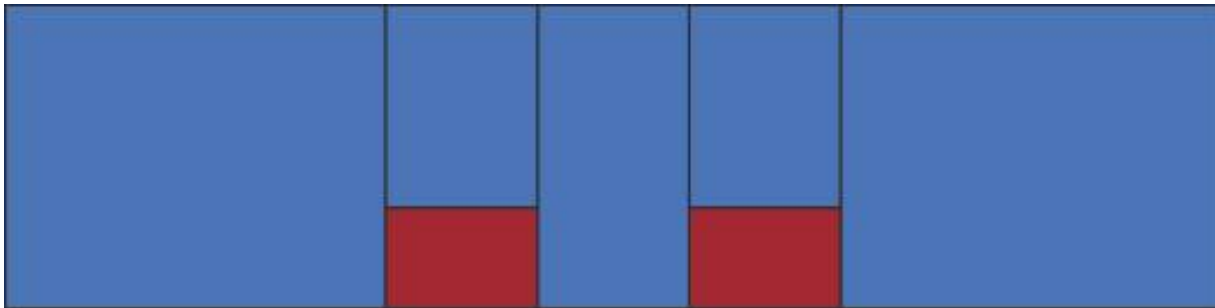
CORRECTION to one piece: the piece of Green fabric for the GRASS should be cut 3" x 12 ½".

HOUSE BLOCK

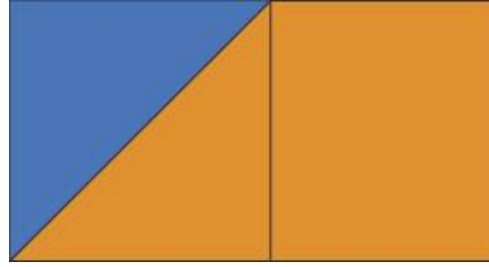
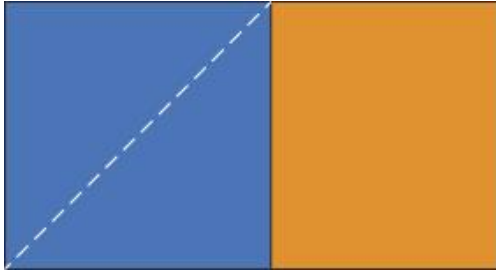
Make 1



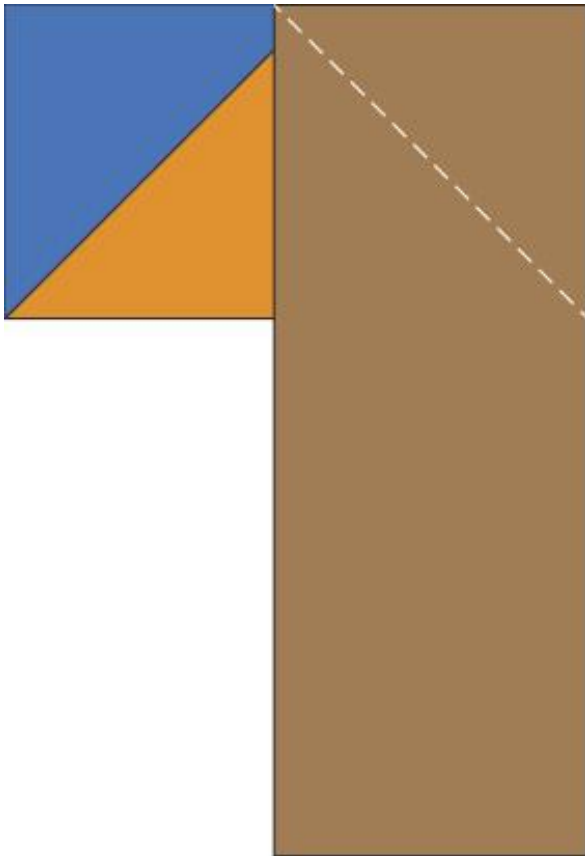
Stitch a 1½" x 2" of Burgundy to a 2" x 2½" rectangle of Blue, using a ¼" seam. Repeat. Stitch these pieces together with a 2" x 3½" rectangle of Blue in the center.



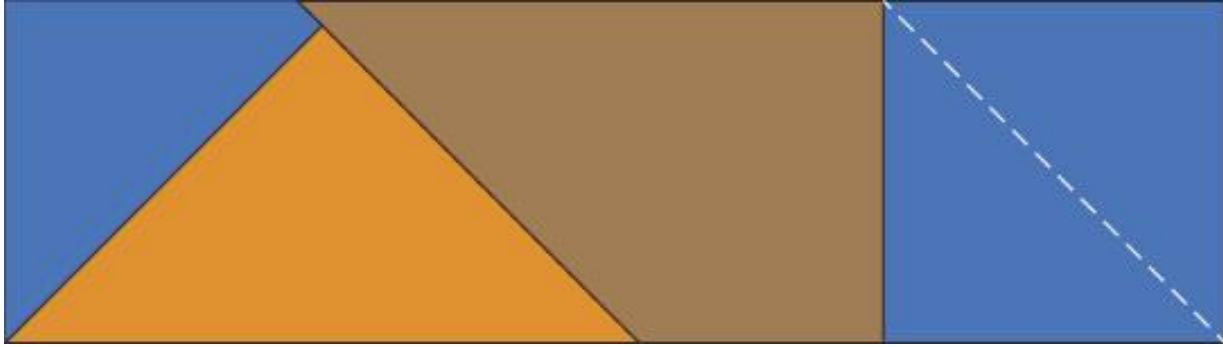
Add a 3½" x 4¼" rectangle of Blue to each side of the previously constructed unit.



Create the roof unit using the Connector Square method used for the leaf stems. Place a $3\frac{1}{2}$ " square of Blue (B) on the left side of the $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle of Light Orange (LO) (right sides together). Draw a line from corner to corner as shown above. Stitch on the drawn line. Press all of the Blue toward the corner and cut away the two (blue and orange) fabrics underneath to make a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance.



Place a $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $9\frac{1}{2}$ " strip of Dark Gold (DG) (right sides together) at a right angle to the right side of the unit you just created (as shown). Draw a diagonal line from the top left corner of the Dark Gold to a point $3\frac{1}{2}$ " down from the top right corner (at the corner of the back piece). Stitch on the drawn line, press, and cut away the excess fabric on the back leaving a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance.



Place a 3½" square of Blue (B) (right sides together) on top of the unit you just created. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner as shown. Stitch on the drawn diagonal line. Press blue flap toward top right corner. Cut away the excess fabric underneath to form a ¼" seam allowance.



Referring to the diagram above: Stitch a 2½" x 4" rectangle of Orange Paisley (OP) to each side of a 2½" x 4" rectangle of Purple (P). (Door area)

Stitch a 2" x 2" square of Purple (P) to a 2" x 2½" rectangle of Orange (O). (Window)

Add a 2½" x 4" rectangle of Orange (O) on the right side of the Purple/Orange unit and a 4" x 3" Orange (O) unit on the left side. (House Side)

Stitch the door area and the window side together as shown above.

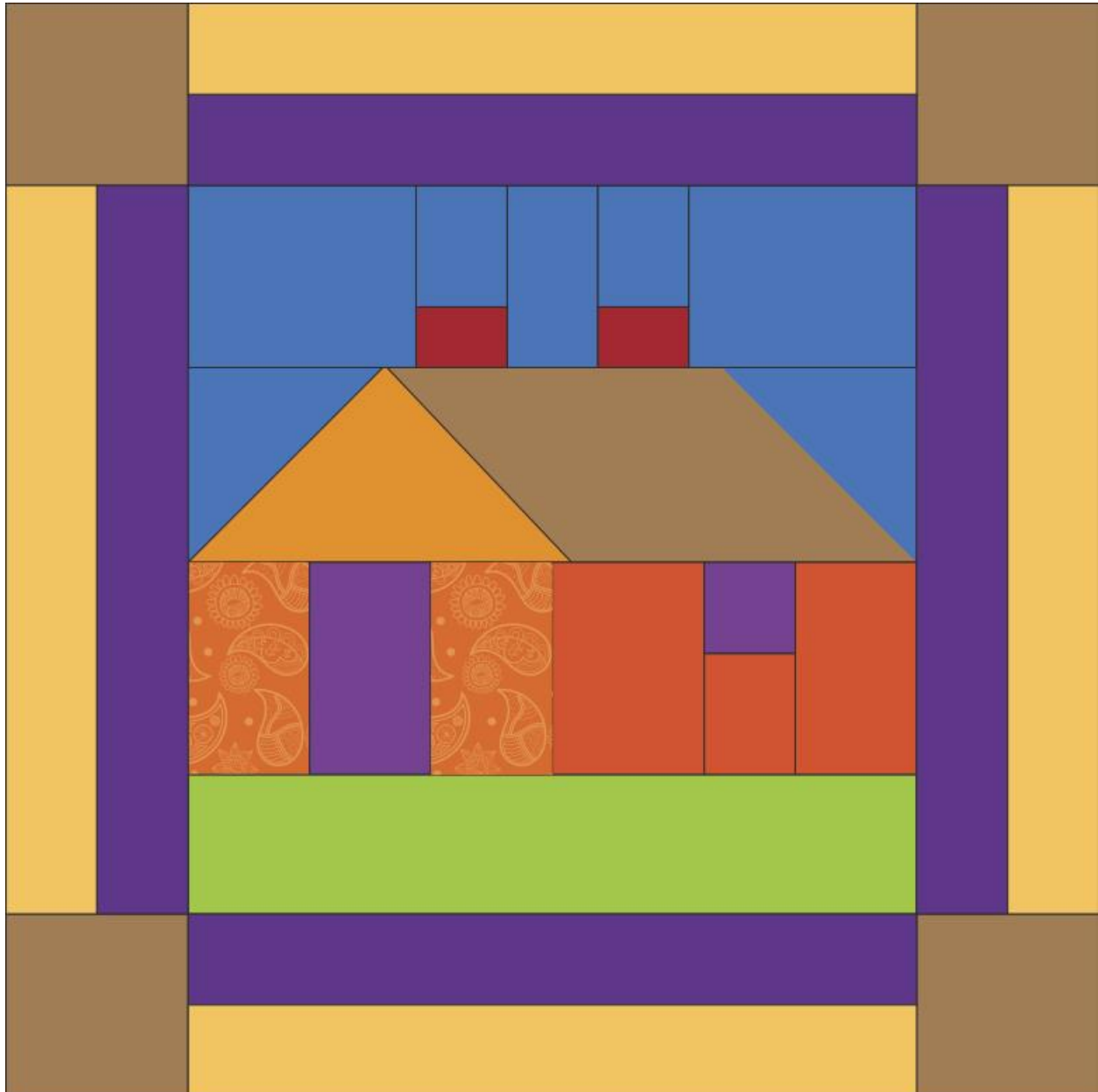
Stitch the 3" x 12½" strip of Green (G) to the bottom of this unit. **(Note that this piece dimension has been corrected.)**

Stitch the roof unit to the top of this unit.

Add the Borders to the House Block

Right sides together, stitch one 2" x 12½" purple strip to one 2" x 12 ½" Cream #2 strip lengthwise. Repeat to make 4 Purple/Cream House Block border units. Add one border unit to each side of the house block. Add a 3½" square of Dark Gold to the ends of the remaining two 12½" units. Add these to the top and bottom of the house block to complete the border with cornerstones.

The House Block should measure 18 ½" square, including borders.



Assemble the Quilt

Follow the piecing diagram. Start by assembling and stitching together the two rows on each side of the house block, then attach them to the house block. Then assemble and stitch the top three rows of blocks together, then the bottom three. Then assemble the three sections of the quilt and stitch the sections together.

Outer Borders

Stitch the 2" x 72½" Red to the 4½" x 72½" Cream #1 lengthwise, right sides together. Repeat. You will make four border units.

Add two strips of Red/Cream #1 to the sides of the quilt.

Add a 6" square of Dark Gold to each end of the remaining Red/Cream border strips. Stitch these pieces to the top and bottom of the quilt.

Bind as desired.
